


June is when we launch into summer reading and all of the fun programs, many sponsored by our Friends of the Library. Later in this newsletter you

I hope you will make it a point to stop by the Library and check out some of our summer reading fun as well as get a few books to read.



New Mobile Library In Progress

Our New Mobile Library is now a work in progress and we are in touch weekly with the folks at TechOps in Stevensville, MD. We are hoping to take delivery by the beginning of July and then we will be working on the wrap which is being designed by Barbara Brecher, a local artist and friend of the Library. Check out the sketch below of the interior, this is just one of many we received before work began. We are most excited about the monitor on the outside as well as external plugs for charging stations. We will no longer have to run the engine to power the generator. Our interior lights and the

items we need for service will all be powered by a battery pack connected to a solar panel. More environmentally friendly for everyone. I hope you will come celebrate with us when we get ready for our launch. In the meantime, donations are still needed to help cover the cost of upgrading and the wrap. To think one phone call, text message, or email could spell financial ruin for an unscrupulous person is unfathomable, but this threat is real. Here at Northumberland Public Library we provide practical suggestions and steps you can take to avoid the above fraudulent activities.

Before you answer that call, text message, or email stop in and ask our local techie if it is worth your hard earned money. We provide thirty minute appointments with someone who has been in the IT industry for thirty eight years. We also have an electronics, cellphone, and computer class on Mondays from 3-5, except holidays.

Tip: If you are not sure if you are about to be scammed. Take a screenshot of the suspected fraudulent activity, bring it to the library and let us investigate it for you. If you are not sure how to take a screenshot stop by and let us show you.

Friends of Northumberland Public Library Launch Membership Drive Lottery Tickets Go On Sale By Cheryl Reed

The nonprofit Friends of Northumberland Public Library is launching a membership drive to increase financial support for the public library in Heathsville. The library depends on money raised by the Friends nonprofit to buy books for its mobile library, to pay for summer interns, underwrite a summer reading program, and fund all special programs at the library, such as visiting author talks and a family fun night.

Last year the Northumberland Library received a little less than half of its \$420,000 operating budget from the county and about 20 percent from the state. The rest was made up by private donations and funds raised by Friends.

"I cannot do special programs without the Friends' support," said Jane Blue, Northumberland librarian. "I am so thankful for everything they do. Whenever I've needed something, they've always stepped forward and are willing to support it."

The biggest source of the Friends' contributions comes from the Ye Olde Book Shoppe, a used bookstore at 7072 Northumberland Highway in Heathsville. But that financial source was paused after a car struck the side wall of the building March 22, forcing the store to close for repairs. It was the third time in 14 months that the building has been struck by cars and the store forced to close for months during necessary reconstruction. In April, the book shop lost \$800 in revenue while still having to pay rent.

Last year Ye Olde Book Shoppe raised \$24,397 for the Northumberland library. So far, this fiscal year beginning in July, the bookstore has raised \$20,000 but was forced to close again last fall in September and October for building repairs after a car hit the building and then again after this latest accident in March. Blue said she doesn't know when repairs will be completed and the bookstore can reopen.

The closure comes at a critical time for the library as it is currently raising money for a new mobile library van, which costs \$213,000 fully retrofitted as a library with books. Private donations have raised \$170,000 for the van so far. But the library still lacks \$43,000. The library's current mobile van has required repeated costly repairs and the generator runs on gas. The new van generator uses lithium batteries and a solar panel.

On April 23, the Friends raised \$1,100 for signage for the mobile library by hosting an English Tea at the library. The sold-out event was so popular that the Friends plans-to host future teas to raise money.

Another popular fundraising event the Friends nonprofit is sponsoring this summer is the library lottery. This year's lottery is called the "2023 Inflation Busting Lottery" and the Friends will be selling 300 tickets. The grand prize is \$5,000; six runner-up prizes of \$500 will be given. Tickets are \$100 a piece but be purchased collectively with friends and family. The lottery winners will be drawn at the Sept. 16 Heathsville Farmers Market.

Friends' annual memberships are \$20 for a single, \$35 for a family and \$100 for a benefactor. Benefits of membership are a free book after five book purchases and a gift certificate for benefactors. Members are invited to all events at the library, including a volunteer dinner in the spring and an appreciation lunch in the fall.
